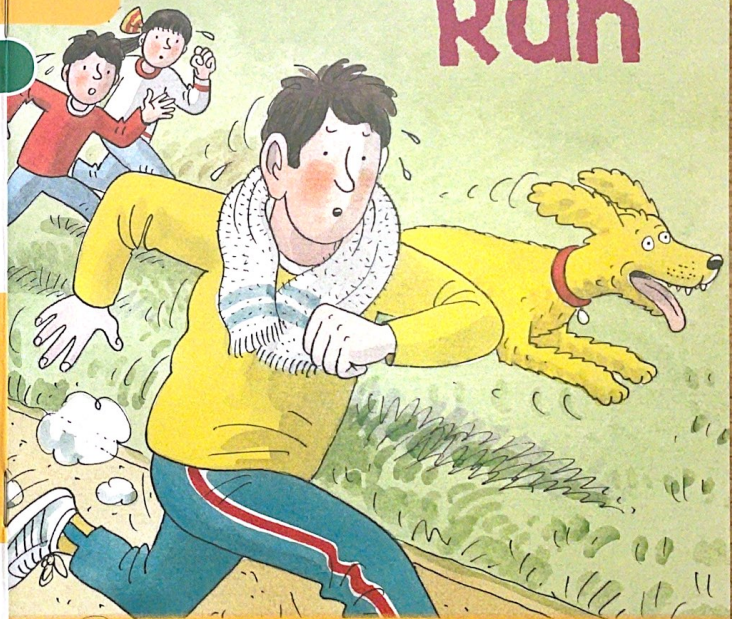

BEFORE READING

Talk together

- Look at the title and cover. Ask: *What do you think might happen in this story?*
- Look at the picture on page 4. Read the poster together. Talk about charity races and how people raise money by getting family and friends to sponsor them.
- Look through the book and talk about the pictures.

About the words in this book

- Your child should be able to sound out and blend some words, which may include:

**old day came told times
running bikes round hole**

- Some words may be more challenging. Encourage or model blending, then read the words below to your child if necessary.

**oh looked
called couldn't**



DURING READING

Enjoy the story together. If your child needs support to read the story:

- Remind your child to sound out and blend unfamiliar words from left to right.
- Look for compound words, where two words create a bigger word, e.g. *moonlight*.
- If a word is still too tricky, simply say the whole word for your child.
- Re-read sentences to focus on their meaning where necessary.



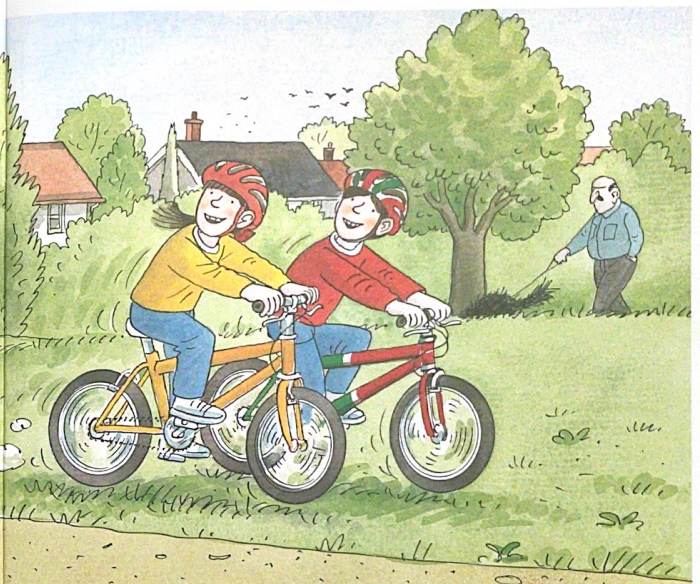

"I want to get fit," he said.

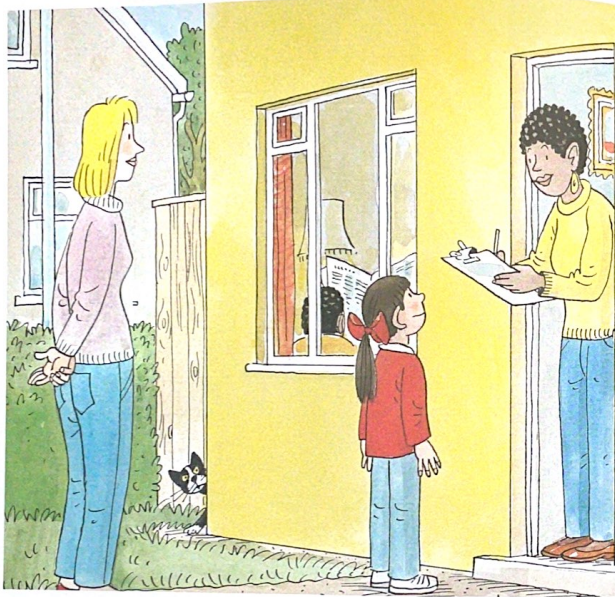


Biff and Chip went with Dad. They

"Keep going, Dad," said Biff.

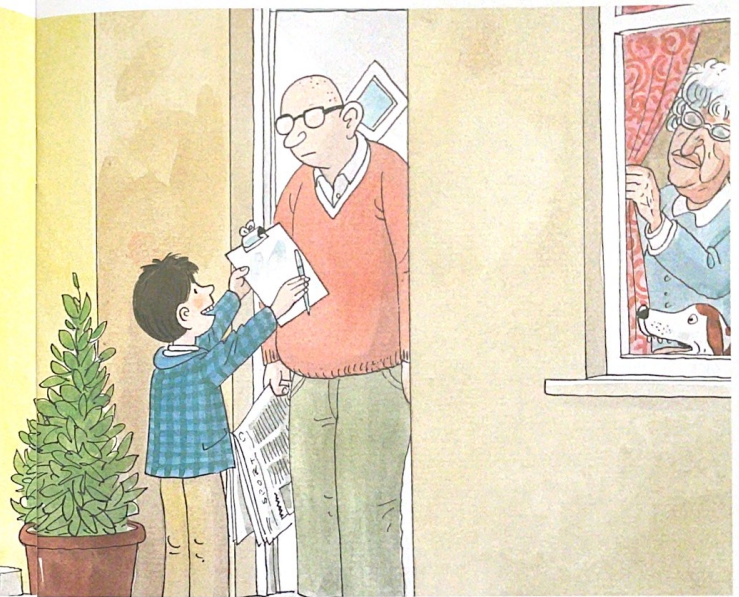


Dad had an idea. He wanted to do the Fun Run.

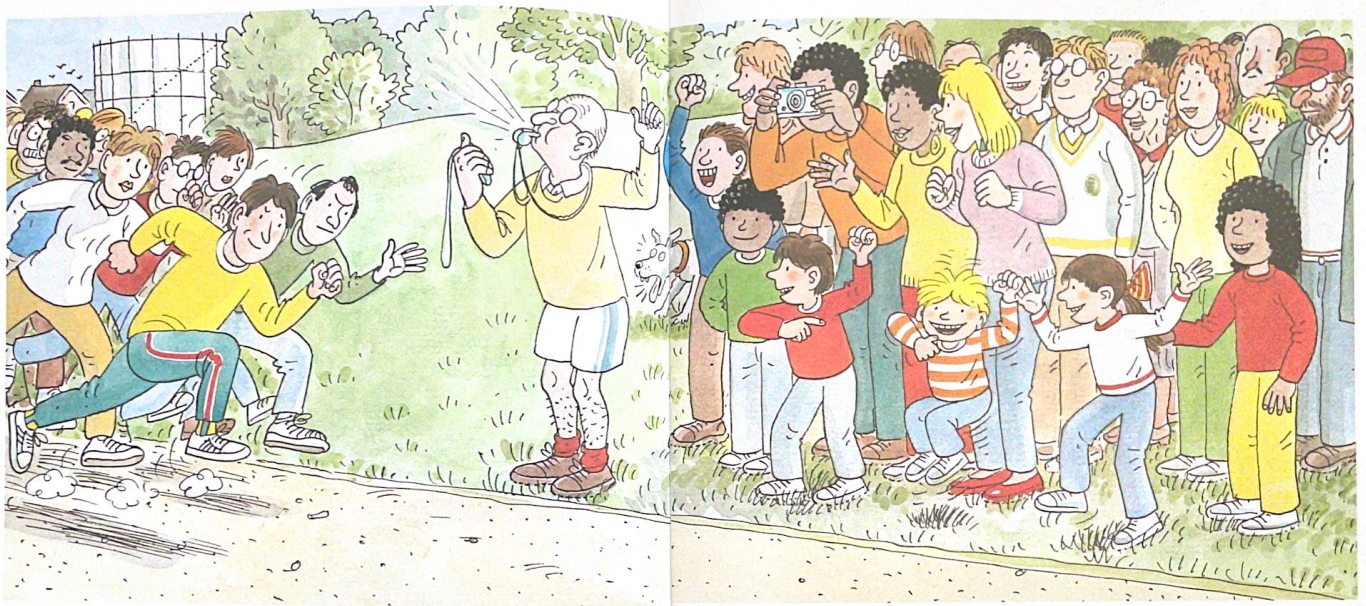
“What a good idea,” said Mum. “But it’s a long way to run!”

"Go on, Dad!" called Kipper.

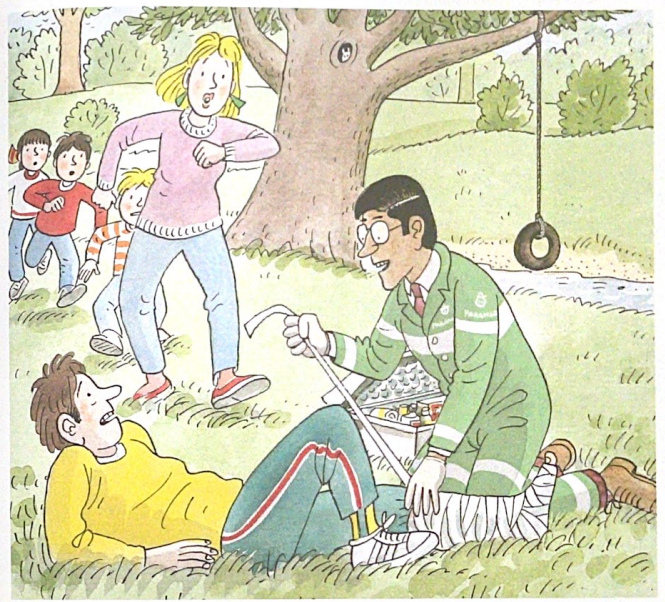


The Fun Run went around the park.

"It's a long way to run."

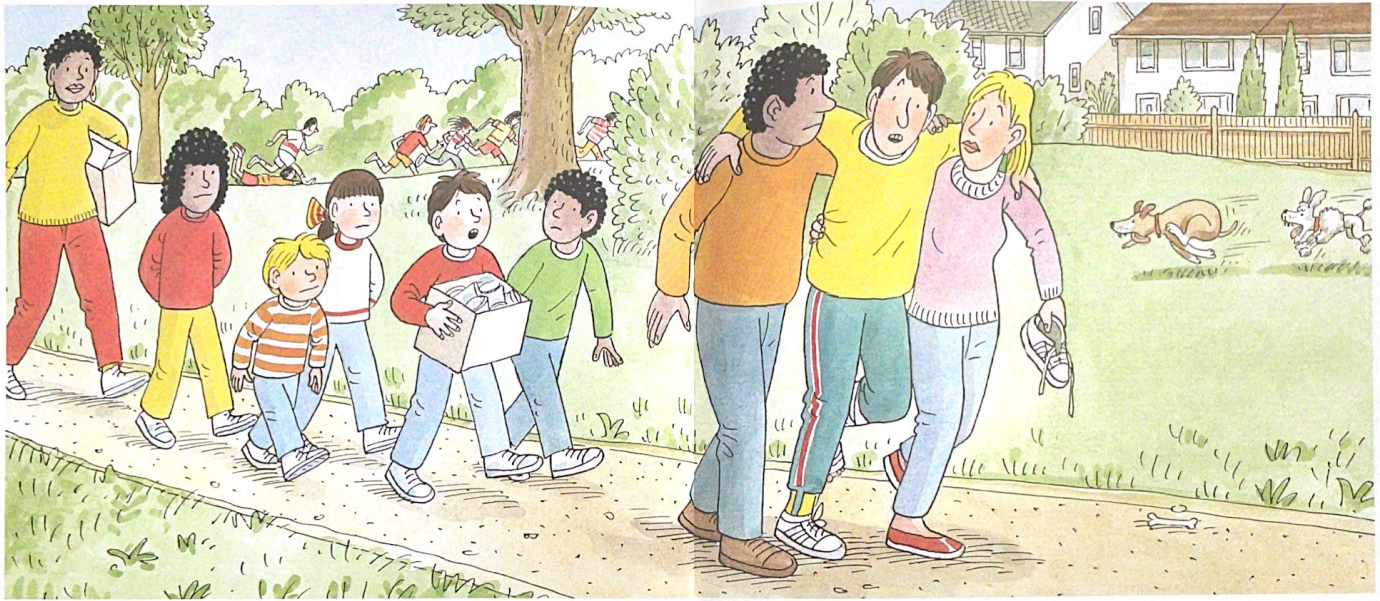
Dad ran well. He ran round the park

"Ouch!" said Dad. "My foot!"

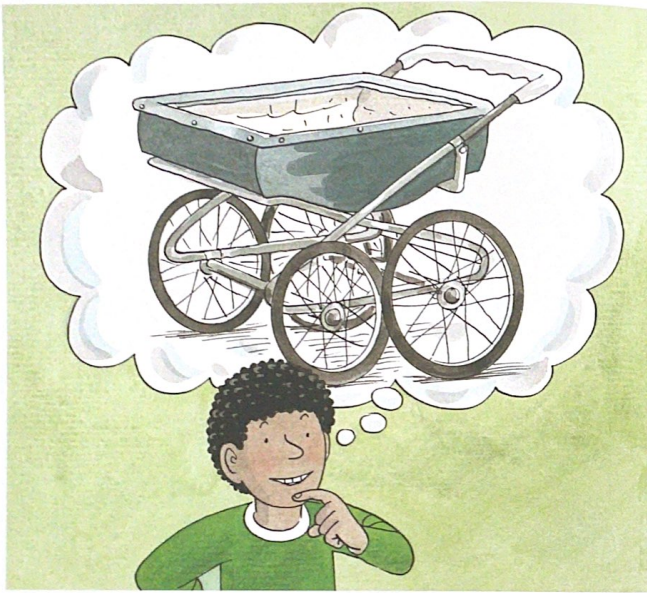


A man looked at Dad's foot.

run on it."

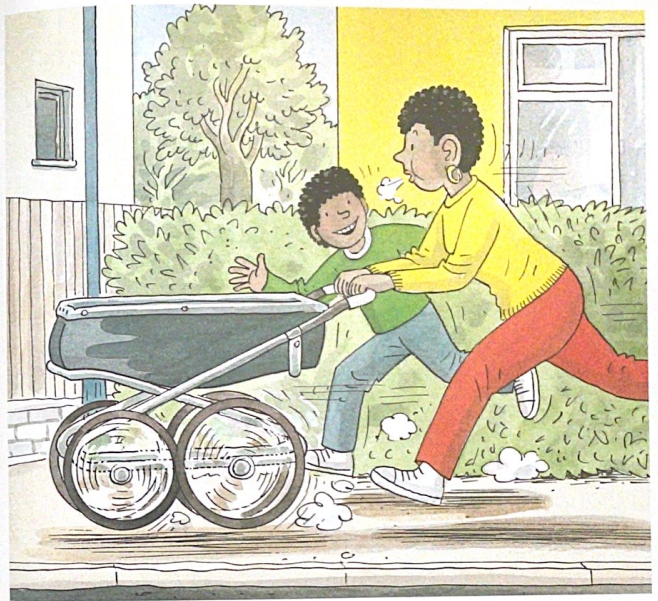


Dad couldn't finish the Fun Run.

old Dad!"

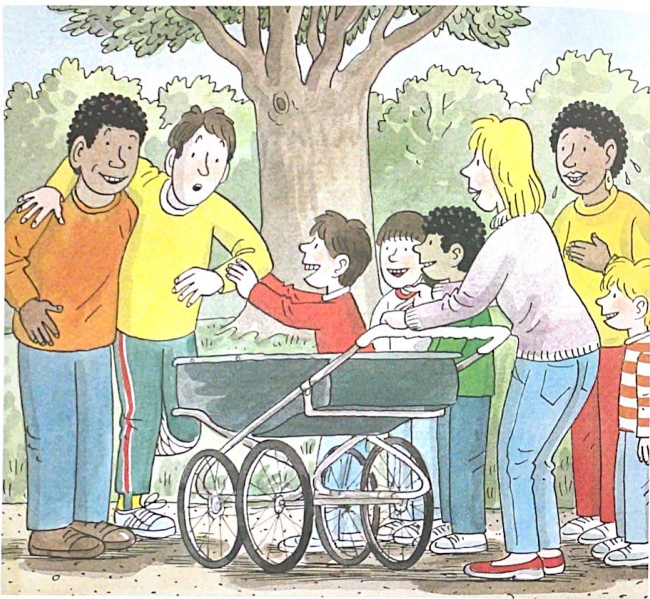
Dad was upset.

the old pram and ran back with it.

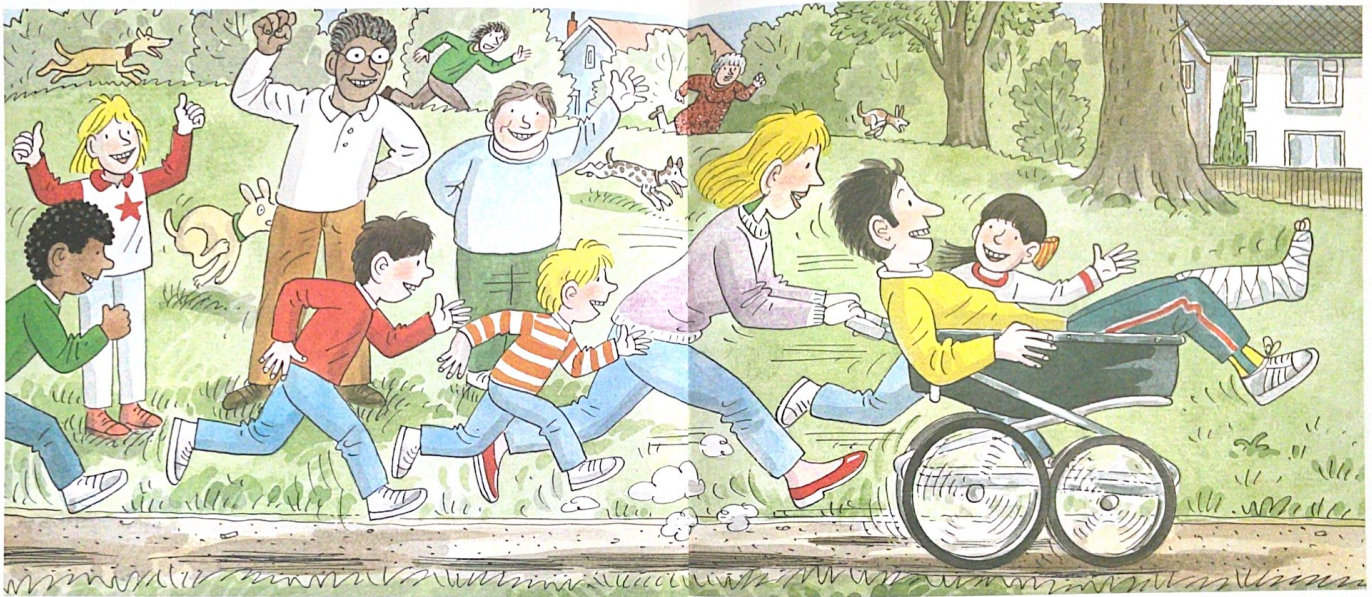


“Come on, Dad,” said Chip. “Get in the pram.”

“Hooray!” everyone called. “It’s not far now!”

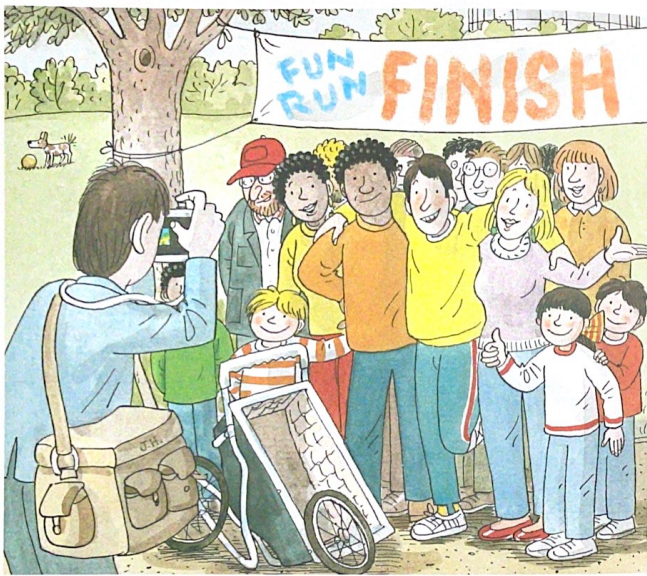
“But it’s a long way to push a pram,” said Mum.
