Respiratory Viruses

The Welsh Government have made updated changes to the following guidance for respiratory viruses including COVID-19 to provide further clarity:

Guidance for people with symptoms of a respiratory infection, including COVID-19 | GOV.WALES

Attending education is important for children and young people's development, health and well-being. The long-term impact of missing education should not be underestimated.

Children and young people with mild symptoms can continue to attend their education setting. Mild symptoms include a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, in children who are otherwise well.

They should be encouraged to cover their mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when coughing and/or sneezing. They should wash their hands after using or disposing of tissues.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home. They should avoid contact with other people where they can. They can go back to their setting when they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to attend.

Cost of the School Day

You will know that for some time we have been looking at how we can reduce and minimise the cost of sending your child to school. In the post-Covid recovery period and the ongoing cost of living and inflation crisis, it is so important to bear in mind that many people are struggling.

When we talk about 'cost' we mean a few things. The first aspect of cost is the number of fundraising activities for school and for charities we support each year. We want to promote children's kindness, compassion and generosity but not at parents' expense so we've changed our language around facilitating donations rather than it being conditional (eg: £1 to wear non-uniform, as previously). ParentPay has been helpful in making donations less visible, inconspicuous and more private. We know there's a cost to parents if we ask for an item of clothing that you do not have and we know there's a cost to both your time and patience when you learn about specific requests with little notice. Our themed days have become more generic rather than simply asking you to dress up your children, for example wear something Christmassy instead of Christmas Jumper Day. We hope that this will reduce cost and stress and ensure all children can feel included. We don't want children to want to stay at home because their parents can't afford a dressing up costume!

Then there's the 'emotional cost' of coming to school for children. We're really aware of how it feels if you don't have the right uniform, if you don't have a coat, if your shoes are too small, if your trousers are ripped, if you don't have dressing up clothes or if you are wearing uniform when everyone else is dressed up or in expensive costumes. We work hard to make sure that children would never feel left out or different because of an activity we had planned or designed. This emotional cost of the school day extends to parents too in how they feel when they are struggling to provide clothing or equipment but feel they have no other choice.

Last year we opened The Community Cabin which has been a great success allowing every child to attend school in full uniform for a few pounds. The Community Cabin is also great for teaching the children about recycling and reusing items of clothing that are still good quality. The shop also includes sanitary and toiletries to support our families with these simple essential, but costly items. We are thrilled with how many families are using The Cabin, whatever the motivation. We now would like to see more trainers and sporting equipment donated which could allow a child to join a local club or activity which they might otherwise have been unable to.

We have worked very hard to develop our learning environments, resources and lessons to be exciting and motivating for the children throughout the school. We understood from the Parent Survey that some of you wanted more school trips. So, we asked you for your views.

The results to the question how many trips would you be prepared to donate towards:

1 trip 3%

The results are very close.

2 trips 29%

This tells me that we can only please 1/3 of our


3 trips 33%

More than 3 trips 34%

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


Multiply Maths
