Safer Routes to School

The safer routes to school programme promotes safer, more environmentally sustainable and healthier ways of getting to and from school, with particular emphasis on walking and cycling. To achieve this, we need to improve conditions (both in safety and the environment) on the main walking and cycling routes to school.

I have had meetings with various MCC staff regarding our school car park and access in to school site on numerous occasions over the past couple of years.

I am glad that the pathway coming from the new estate has been improved. However, I feel that further improvements outside school could/should be made to make the route into school safer, especially for pedestrians. I know that many parents and carers have the same concerns, as I have had conversations with a number of you. Firstly, I am concerned that the new path from the new houses leads directly into the road. I am concerned that there is no path onto the school site at the car exit end. I also have concerns that pupils coming into the Foundation Phase side of the school coming from the new estate have to walk on the road or take chances walking across a muddy path often littered with dog excrement.

I also understand that the school does not have enough car park spaces but that car parking spaces outside the school site are also limited because we are located on a cul-de-sac road.

One suggested option has been to close the road to school traffic at the beginning and end of the school day. I have voiced concerns that cars may then turn in the road as the exit road is not convenient. This would be dangerous for pedestrians.

We would encourage children to walk or cycle to school. However, road safety is a concern: cars, safe ways to cross roads and a lack of adequate paths and cycle paths.

If we want to make a difference, we really need as many parents and carers to give their point of view as possible. Monmouthshire County Council have given me a survey to share with our parents and carers. The more people who voice their concerns the more chance we have of improvements being made. Please add as much detail in your comments as possible. Please feel free to share the link with neighbours who also have concerns about the routes to school.
