Dear Parents and Carers,


Another busy half term has flown by. I cannot believe that we only have 7 weeks left until the end of this academic year!

<u>Uniform</u>

Over the last couple of years following the pandemic, we have been fairly relaxed with school uniform. Now we have The Cabin to support parents with uniform, we can start to be more firm. Children should have a cardigan or a sweatshirt to wear with their normal uniform. Hoodies should *only* be worn for PE days. I would be very grateful if you could support is with this. If you have only bought hoodies for next year, we will be understanding. However, if you are getting new uniform, I would be grateful if you could abide by our guidance.

Our PE uniform is black shorts or joggers and a white t-shirt or a t-shirt in your child's house colour. Some of our pupils are starting to wear clothes that are not uniform on PE days. Please use The Cabin if you need extra clothing.

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Attendance - Late arrivals

We have a number of children regularly arriving late to school. We open our gates at 8.50am so that children are in school to start at 9 o'clock. The gates close at 9 o'clock so anyone arriving after this time has to enter through the main door.

Children who are late receive a late mark (L) in the register and these are monitored by Mrs Balkwill, our attendance lead and the Education Welfare Officer (EWO). We are concerned that children who are late are missing valuable opportunities for spelling practise and their reading session.

Following the guidance of our EWO, parents will need to sign their children in if coming through the main door.

Any children arriving after 9.30 will receive a U code in the register which shows they are present but the code can be used if the EWO wishes to move forward with legal proceedings.

Outdoor Learning

We have had to change the dates for our outdoor learning. We will be having whole learning days on the school field with our tents (fingers crossed this lovely weather continues). Children will be immersed into outdoor activities on our fields at the back of the school, including making their own food and keeping 'camp' tidy.

We will give you further information with individual class letters. However, just to keep you informed, we are planning:

Year 3 Outdoor Learning: Monday 19th June during normal school time

Year 4 Outdoor Learning: Monday 26th June—Tuesday 27th June normal school time

Year 5 Outdoor Learning: Wednesday 28th June— Thursday 29th June (we are planning a sleep over in the tents on 28th June. Friday 30th June is an INSET day)

Year 6 Outdoor learning: Children will only come to school: Thursday 22nd June 10am-9pm Friday 23rd June: 11am-3.20pm


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After School Club
